

The Show would not be complete without the Large Commercial Display's and also the Small Commercial stalls that add that little bit extra to our event.



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
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

- Competitions covered by these rules include: BEEF CATTLE JUDGING DAIRY CATTLE JUDGING MERINO SHEEP JUDGING MEAT SHEEP BREED JUDGING FLEECE JUDGING GRAIN JUDGING VEGETABLE JUDGING
- 2. Competitiors must be over 15 years and under 25 years of age as at 1st May in the year of the State Final at the Sydney Royal Easter Show.
- They must reside in NSW or be in a regular paid employment there or be in full time education in NSW at the time of first competing in any competition year.
- 4. No competitor can represent more than one (1) Show Society in any one (1) Group Final and no more than one (1) Group in a State Final. The winners of any National Final cannot compete at any level in the particular competition that they won.
- 5. Winners of two (2) State Finals in any one (1) class shall not be eligible for future competitions in that class.

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- 6. The Hormal Slide or the computer scoring system is to be used at all Group and State Finals.
- Groups to be entitled to be represented at State level by Two (2) competitors unless otherwise stated.
- Merino Judging—Groups to be entitled to be represented at State level by one (1) competitor,
- Group Secretaries must inform the ASC of the name, address and telephone number of any competitor in judging finals going to State Finals. The ASC will advise these competitors of the venue and time of the State Final
- 10. After the competition is over and awards have been given, the competitors can look at their scores on the Master Sheet only.
- Competitors will be eliminated from the competition if deemed by the Chief Steward to be receiving outside assistance.



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
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#### RING EVENT RULES AND DEFINITIONS

The Committee of Warialda Pastoral and Agricultural Association Inc. provides the following definitions regarding horse exhibits at it's annual show.

The definitions below are as per the SHOW HORSE COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA INC. COMPETITION RULES 2019 book. Competitors should be aware of the entire rulings in the Show Horse Councils Rule Book. An electronic copy of the Rules Book may be accessed at the Secretary's office.

These extracts are deemed to be the main definitions applicable to this Show.

- **3.13** A hack must be at least three (3) years of age to compete in ridden classes at Official Shows.
- 3.15 A MAIDEN HACK is one that has not been placed in any Individual ridden hack class at any Official Show.
- 3.16 A NOVICE HACK is one that has not been placed 1st in any Individual open ridden hack classes at any Official Show. This Novice definition also applies to Show Hunter and Working Show Hunter horses in the relevant competition.
- 3.18 An INTERMEDIATE HACK is one that has not been placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in an Individual ridden hack class at any Royal Show, and including the R.N.A. Bathurst, Toowoomba, Launceston and Geelong Royals. The Intermediate definition also applies to Show Hunter and Working Show Hunter horses in the relevant competition.
- 3.22 The Champion will be selected from the 1st place winners from each of the eligible classes. Under no circumstances shall a judge award equal Champions.
- 3.23 The Reserve Champion will be selected from the remaining 1st place winners and the 2nd placegetter/s from the class/s which supplied the Champion.
- 3.24 Supreme Champion will be according to the Show's schedule.
- 3.25 A Judge officiating at an Official Show is under no obligation to award 1st, 2nd or 3rd place (any placing) if he/she considers such placings are not up to standard.
- 4.1 (a) it is the Competitor's/Exhibitor's responsibility to ensure eligibility for a class.
- (b) Where any ineligibility to compete may occur, the Competitor/Exhibitor (not the Judge) should withdraw from the class/event.
- 4.4 A Competitor/Exhibitor or a member of their family shall not approach a Judge with regard to a decision, unless they first obtain permission from The Ringmaster (*Chief Ring Steward at Warialda Show*) who may arrange an appointment with the Judge, at an appropriate place and time. The Judge or Official may refuse the request. A representative of the organising body shall remain present during any such discussion/meeting.
- 4.5 Once judging has commenced, a competing horse shall not be led or ridden in or out of the ring without the permission of the Judge and/or Ringmaster (*Chief Ring Steward*)
- 4.7 A Competitor/Exhibitor/member shall at all times behave in a proper and respectful manner to Judges, Show Officials and their fellow competitors and not engage in conduct that may bring the sport into disrepute.
- 4.8 Any act of cruelty, excessive discipline or mistreatment of a horse at a SHC Event will result in disqualification from the event and is reportable for Disciplinary action.

#### DRUG TESTING MAY BE CARRIED OUT AT THIS SHOW.

Any competitor found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary Regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee.

**IMPROPER BEHAVIOUR:** Outside assistance to competitors by word, by radio or any other method in all Horse Ring Events will NOT be permitted. If in breach of this ruling, competitors and their exhibits may be dismissed from the event and from the Showground. Competitors names will be submitted to the ASC.

Waiver forms must be signed. Armbands will be supplied and must be worn by competitors. Forms available in this schedule (pages 51 to 55) and from the Secretary's office.

Horse stalls are allocated in order in which fee is received; phone or email bookings will be held for 5 days for payment: Stall Fee is \$10

#### NO TAPE YARDS TO BE ERECTED. ALL HORSE STALLS TO BE FILLED BEFORE PORTABLE YARDS CAN BE ERECTED.

The Committee and Stewards reserve the right to alter the programme if deemed necessary.

**Horse measuring:** We accept EFA and North West Group Measuring Certificates and in the event of a dispute the Warialda P and A Assoc. Inc. Committee's measurement overrides all others. No protests will be dealt with unless accompanied by a \$50 fee which is to deposited with the Secretary.

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## REGULATIONS OF THE WARIALDA PASTORAL AND AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION INC.

- All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor and if requested, the Exhibitor must make a Statutory Declaration as to the correctness of his/her entry form in this and other particulars.
- 2. The Warialda P & A Inc. will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by any exhibit. It shall be blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising form such accident ALL RIDERS competing in the jumping events and any other events deemed by the Committee, must wear skull caps approved by the Australian Standards Assoc.
- No Exhibitor or their Agent shall be permitted to be with the Stewards or Judges during the time of Judging of the exhibits (except in all livestock sections) unless by special request of the Stewards. The Exhibitor, Exhibits, or any person infringing this Regulation shall be at once disqualified.
- 4. Protest must be delivered to the Secretary (in writing) accompanied by the amount deemed by the Committee (which shall be forfeited if the Committee considers the appeal frivolous) on, or before the close of the Show. Upon the disqualification, suspension, or imposition of a penalty in connection with an Exhibitor or Exhibition, the Exhibitor concerned shall be notified by the Secretary that they have the right of appeal. This will be dealt with by a Disputes Committee consisting of five (5) Committee Members. For the Exhibitor to exercise their Right of Appeal they must within fourteen (14) days deliver to the Secretary an application in writing accompanied by a fee set by the Disputes Committee. Whenever an Appeal is held, the Disputes Committee shall be responsible for the recording of the proceedings and the notation of evidence.
